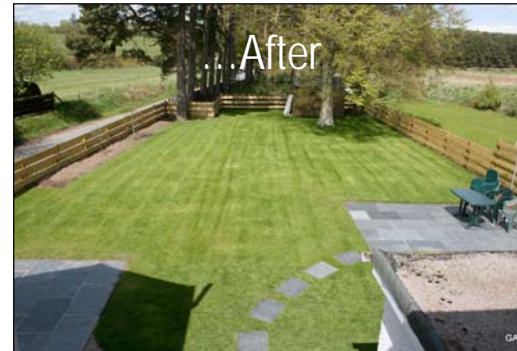
"The team cleared, flattened, fenced and turfed our back garden, which had hardly been touched in 15 years. We now have a toddler friendly garden with two patios."

She explains: *“The thing I enjoy about working full time is working with people. I am now working more with the residents serving them meals. I may get the chance to go to college and learn more skills. It is much better than being on benefits and I get paid more for weekends and holidays. I am saving up to go on holiday to America next year.”*

Kerri started work with us on a New Deal placement at the end of 2008. She continued to work voluntarily with us until she became a full time paid member of staff last Spring. She is a valued member of the team and specialises in helping Alfie with providing refreshments and lunches for business conferences in the Credo centre.

Kerri says:

“I enjoy meeting customers and dealing with them. I also enjoy the companionship of the staff. I have learned how to take on responsibilities and I have gained a sense of confidence and self esteem. I would say to anyone considering coming to train at Gateway – Go for it as it has helped me tremendously.”



Marie came on a New Deal placement in December 2009. She successfully finished her full 13 week programme.

Marie said:

“I came to Gateway to gain experience to get a job as I had none. I learned all about working in a café – customer service, using the touch screen till, about the different cakes, health & hygiene and using the dishwasher. I would recommend Gateway to others as the staff are friendly and easy to get along with, and I learned new things. I am now working part time as a Dinner Lady. I enjoy the work. I hope in the future to get promoted to a school closer to home and to be able to work more hours.”



Anna has recently finished a New Deal placement and looking for a job:

“I am a single parent and my children have come to an age that I can go out and work. I enjoy it and have found that it is possible with help from after school clubs. I came to work at Gateway to give me some confidence, to meet new people and get experience in different aspects of work. I have become more comfortable working with the public and I find it a lot easier to start conversations as I have learned how to approach people when serving at tables in the café. I would like a job to pay the bills and put food on the table, as well as having the occasional treat. I am not fussy about what I do I would just like to work for a better future for me and my girls.”
